Be ready to experience firsthand traditional street art, post-ups, sticker art, environmental art and more plus video and sound scapes. These couches will be created and evolve right before our eyes over the four days and are open places for public to sit and chat and even join into the couch evolution.

Then look out for set times where you will travel from couch to couch experiencing a series of live art acts where each couch is a stage and where performance artists respond to the voices of the youth.
